We beg to confirm the visit of our Mr. Fidler with one of our bellhangers on May 11th for the purpose of improving the circle of bellropes.


The 6th and 7th ropes were altered as suggested in your letter of April 9th, but it was not found possible to move the 5th rope quite as much as it was desired owing to an iron bar which runs East to West between the boards of the ceiling of the ringing room and the boards on the top side. Chutes and rollers were fixed to these three ropes and the bells handled quite all right.

It was not found possible to move the 3rd rope owing to the heavy wood moulding round the hatch.

Whilst in the tower the job was looked over and all nuts and bolts were left properly tightened up.

We understand from Mr. Fidler that you are satisfied with the alterations which have been made and we hope that all will now go well with the peal.
