# The Rector writes

27th April, 1996.

Robin and Esther Hazlehurst leave us this month to take up his new appointment as Vicar of Christ's Church Harwood on June 13th. Robin will preach his final sermon at Deane at the Family Communion service on May 5th but his farewell services will be at St. Andrew's the following Sunday. After the morning service on May 12th there will be a buffet lunch at St. Andrew's at which a presentation will be made to Robin and Esther. If you wish to be associated with this will you please place your donation in a suitably marked envelope and hand it to our churchwardens. There will be no evening service at Deane on that day so that we can join with the St. Andrew's congregation for Robin's final service at 6.30 pm.

At the final session of the nine Alpha Groups which completed the course just before Easter several members spoke of the help which they personally had received since joining their group. In some cases they had gained a deeper understanding of the Christian Faith. In other cases it was a new experience of the Holy Spirit of God, whilst others greatly appreciated the opportunity of getting to know other members with whom previously they had only a passing acquaintance. Two new Alpha groups are planned to start on Tuesdays, one in the afternoon and the other in the evening commencing on May 14th. If you would like to benefit from this popular course of basic Christian teaching then you are invited to join those who have already signed on. Brochures giving details are now available in Church.

For those who have graduated through the Alpha course you are most welcome to join the summer season of home groups which begin at the end of the month.

I wish to commend to you once again Christian Aid Week, May 13-18th. This is not only a major means of raising money for the disadvantaged and suffering in other parts of the world, but it also serves as a timely reminder to all of us who live in a relatively affluent country that we have a responsibility towards our fellow human beings who are poor. Though on grounds of conscience I do not have a weekly flutter on the National Lottery I do recognise that many organisations, charities and projects are beginning to receive considerable grants from this source. But so long as there are winners there will also be losers, and many of the smaller charities report a considerable fall in their income. Certainly there has been a reduction in what is given through our Lent, Harvest and Christmas Appeals to those charities and missions which would never qualify to receive grants from the lottery, even if their conscience allowed them to. I readily admit that delivering and collecting Christian Aid envelopes isn't one of my most enjoyable and exciting pastimes, but I do it each year because whatever small amount I may collect could possibly make all the difference between life and death for some poor unknown soul. We will need at least another 70 volunteers after me. There is a list in church for you to offer your services.

Soon after I became a school governor one of my fellow governors, who was also a councillor, boasted that he was a governor of 56 schools in Bolton! This may have looked impressive on his election address, but if his track record at our school was anything to go by, then quite frankly it meant nothing. In more recent years successive Education Acts have increased the importance of the rôle of school governors and have rightly limited the number of schools that one can be attached to. A recent survey has indicated that there are likely to be 60,000 vacancies across the country. The greatest need is for parent and co-opted governors particularly in inner city and metropolitan areas such as Bolton. A considerable number of our congregation serve as governors in the schools in our town, and our own St. Mary's C.E. Primary School has a full complement of governors at present. I will be very happy to supply further information and to encourage more of us to serve in this way.

#### SOMETHING NEW ON TELEVISION

A few years ago one of our speakers on Sermon's Day was Mr. Bryce Cooke of Piccadilly Radio. Bryce is now the Area Organiser for ARK 2 which is a Christian Cable T.V. Channel due to come on air in September this year.



OPEN DOOR TELEVISION

This channel will be British, addressing a British culture. It will most emphatically not be American, and it will seek at all costs to avoid the horror stories which we hear about American T.V. evangelism.

The philosophy behind ARK 2 is to reach some of that 70% of our fellow citizens who admit to The excellence of the programming across a wide believing in God, but who go no further. spectrum, presented and produced by committed Christians will ensure an entirely different channel ARK 2 seeks to be an answer to the constant complaint of from anything we have at present. Christians that television is largely rubbish, a purveyor of poor standards and morality. If ARK 2 is to succeed in redressing the balance it needs the support of the whole Christian family in 3 traditional areas - prayer, creativity and money.

To get ARK 2 up and running in September £8 million is required of which £6 million has already been raised in sponsorship and advertising. The remainder is a challenge to committed Christians to get the vision. It is estimated that if every member of every U.K. Church fellowship gave £10, the problem would be solved. The Bishop of Manchester is giving his support and the Rector is happy to supply any further information.
