

The Rector writes

31st August, 1996.

After the summer break our autumn programme of mid-week activities begins this month, and I wish to draw your attention to some of these. **Firstly**, there are the **Home Groups** which are a feature of every healthy Church because they compliment and supplement what happens in Church on a Sunday. Meeting with fellow Christians in the informality of a home enables us to learn from one another through the Scriptures as well as getting to know one another far better than we can ever do in a more formal setting. In the five sessions planned at fortnightly intervals throughout the autumn we shall be using some nationally produced material called "Sunday/Monday". Its aim is to help us to relate the faith we profess in Church on Sundays to the lives we live in the world Mondays and during the rest of the week. Providing there is sufficient interest to make a group(s) viable an alternative series entitled "Living with Loss" will be available. Because a considerable amount of administration is involved in planning the home group programme do please indicate which group you would like to join as soon as possible and preferably by Sunday September 8th at the latest.

Secondly, in preparation for the **Confirmation Service** at the Cathedral on Friday November 15th, there is a short course planned for those adults who have completed one of the Alpha courses or who are communicant members of other Christian Churches wishing to transfer their membership to the C. of E. This group will meet at the Rectory at 8.00 pm on Tuesdays September 10th and October 22nd and on Wednesdays October 9th and November 6th. If you are thinking of joining this group kindly let me know.

September 8th is to be observed as **Racial Justice Sunday** at the request of all the main Church Leaders in this country. We live in a world where many are treated unfairly, harassed and discriminated against on account of their race and colour of their skin. This occasion gives us the opportunity to consider those issues and to pray for a more just and harmonious society.

Bolton Royal Infirmary. For several months now the various departments have been progressively transferring to the new development at Bolton General Hospital. For many people this has been a painful and unpopular decision, but it is a major part of a long planned scheme which I have little doubt will bring many benefits to patients by having all the acute services on the one site. I had occasion to be one of the first 'out-patients' within a couple of days of that department transferring, and there was no comparison with the conditions at the 'Royal'. I have been asked to draw your attention to the fact that the Accident and Emergency Department moves in the early hours of Wednesday September 11th. I hope you don't have cause to need to make use of this service, but if you do make sure you go to the 'General'. It has long been a complaint that neither hospital had a Chapel; this has now been provided in the new development and it will be dedicated by Church leaders on Sunday afternoon, September 29th.

I have heard from **Granada Television** that the programme featuring the problems encountered by the popularity of some Church Secondary Schools is to be broadcast on Tuesday October 1st at 9.00 pm. on Channel Four in the "Witness" slot. The programme focuses on the Canon Slade School and it was because several of our families experienced difficulties in securing a place for their child that the T.V. cameras were in our Church on Sunday 19th May. Since it often takes 8 hours of filming to produce 3 minutes of programme I don't anticipate much more than a fleeting glance of our service that morning!

There is a short video you can borrow which will answer many of the questions you may have about Spring Harvest. If you are interested or would like more information please contact us. We need to book very soon.


