

Harvest Gifts.

There was such an encouraging number of traditional harvest gifts this year that we had enough and more than enough to give generous parcels to the sick and elderly who live The remaining items were given to two local charities - to Sarah Lodge and Sarah Lodge is home for a number of young women who are at risk and would otherwise be homeless. It was initiated by the Methodist Church and is run by the Manchester Methodist Housing Group. One of our own members, Sheila Dewhurst-Taylor, Apparently our gift was put to very good use as the residents joined together and made a large communal supper for themselves which was greatly enjoyed. Watch is another scheme pioneered by the local Churches. It provides a safe haven for Bolton's street community with an all-night shelter at Spa Mill. In previous years it has operated for the 3 coldest months of the year, but because it has been promised support from the Borough Council, the Bolton and Wigan Health Authority and the police it is now planning to operate for the whole 12 months of the Millennium year. The scheme has snowballed since it started 2 years ago for it is now able to provide a place where the homeless can get free food, health advice and treatment, clothes and a place to sleep.

Christian Giving Envelopes.


These will be distributed during November. If you read the back page of this publication you will notice that throughout this past year our weekly regular giving has been below last year's. This has to be a cause for great concern. A major reason for this decrease is that fewer envelopes are being distributed and of those that are, a sizeable number of people are either not using them as they are meant to be used or are not using them at all. For instance, the Church Council was informed recently that of the 217 current sets of envelopes 25 (i.e. 12%) are not being used and consequently will not be re-issued. I, therefore, wish to encourage all current users of Christian Giving Envelopes to review their level of giving, and to invite those who still don't use them to start doing so.

AFRICA



Civil war continues, and the United Nations estimates that 200 people are dying each day. In areas such as Uige there are refugees who have walked for two weeks to escape the fighting, and sleeping sickness is rife. Pray for peace, for the 1.7 million internally displaced people and the 2 million classified as "very vulnerable".

ETHIOPIA

Approximately 4-5 million people are affected by famine, and food aid is desperately needed. Pray that relief will reach those in need and for a successful harvest in December/January. The Ethiopian government has rejected the peace deal to end the border war with Eritrea - pray that a way forward will be found for a genuine and lasting peace.

EUROPE/MIDDLE EAST

MIDDLE EAST

Formal talks on the creation of a Palestinian state are taking place after the signing of a revised Wye River deal by Yasser Arafat and Ehud Barak. Talks are aimed at reaching a framework for a final status agreement in five months and a full accord in a year on issues including Jerusalem, Palestinian refugees and final borders. Pray that talks will be successful and lead to lasting peace in the region.

TURKEY

Continue to pray for those whose lives have been shattered by the earthquake as they begin the rebuilding process. Pray for those who have lost family and friends and for the local churches addressing immediate and long-term needs. Tearfund has made contact with a

number of evangelical
Christian groups and churches
working in the aftermath of the
earthquake. All gifts from supporters specifically for the
Turkish earthquake are being channelled to Tearfund's
US equivalent World Relief for their shelter programme
being carried out with Turkish Protestant churches.

UZBEKISTAN

Praise God that the four Christians imprisoned for their faith have now been released and their sentences commuted. Praise God too that the local church, denied registration with the government in 1994, has now received registration. Pray for the men as they return to everyday life and for the Christian population in Uzbekistan.

LATIN AMERICA

COLOMBIA

Pray for the ongoing reconstruction work in the town of Armenia following the earthquake earlier this year. Pray too for Tearfund partner the Foundation of Christian Churches of Quindio, involved in rebuilding and rehousing work.

ASIA



Pray for peace to be restored following the violence in the aftermath of the referendum on independence. Half the province's inhabitants have been driven from their homes and food aid is needed. Pray for those who have lost homes and family and for the UN as they send in a peace-keeping force.
