

Annual Parochial Church Meeting (A.P.C.M.)

When our Church Council was planning this year's A.P.C.M. they simply could not find a convenient evening in the period allocated between the final meeting of the outgoing council and the deadline date of April 30th. In the end it was decided to hold the meeting on Sunday April 30th immediately after the morning service. This is very much in line with what is becoming a common practice in many cathedrals and churches. After all what is wrong with doing the Lord's business on the Lord's Day? In the context of the meeting there will be an interval for us to partake of a Bring and Share meal. Since this would appear to be an economic use of time it is our hope that more of us will make the effort to attend what is the most important business meeting of our Church in the year. As usual at this meeting there will be a review of the past year followed by the elections of Churchwardens and a new Church Council together with the appointment of sidesmen and women. It will make for a more responsible election if we make good use of the nomination lists during the period leading up to the meeting rather than suggesting people on 'the spur of the moment' at the meeting.

Important Tax Changes

For some time now the Chancellor, Gordon Brown, has indicated that it is his intention to encourage more people to give to charity, and to make the first decade of the new millennium a decade of giving. After an in-depth consultation process he has announced the following radical changes to the tax system which take effect from April 6th.

Firstly, giving by **Deed of Covenant** is to cease so that no longer will you have to promise to give a set sum for a period of at least 4 years. This has always been a deterrent for those who feared an uncertain future, though I think it must be said that our Church has never held people to their promise if they have fallen on hard times. This form of giving is to be replaced by Gift Aid, for which there is no longer any upper or lower limit. It means therefore, that for any gift, however small or large, a charity can claim 30p. in the £1 from the Inland Revenue when the donor is a tax payer. All the donor has to do is to sign a form to say that he/she is a taxpayer, and that the Church or Charity may claim back from the Revenue some of the tax he/she has already paid. These forms are now available from Sid Harris. system like this is open to abuse the Inland Revenue make spot checks on our records. We have to be able to prove to their satisfaction that the donations have in fact been This is why it is essential that you place your donation in a Christian Giving Envelope or make a regular contribution by Banker's Standing Order. I hope that everyone of us who pays tax will see how more effective our giving can be by doing something as easy as signing such a form!

Secondly, if you are employed and your employer operates a payroll giving scheme such as Give As You Earn then the Government is offering for the next 3 years to make an additional 10% bonus on all charitable donations made in this way. Thus a donation of £1 becomes £1.40.

I warmly welcome these changes because I believe they should make it easier and simpler to give to charities and more effective too.

WORLD WATCH Prayer Link

Asia

- INDONESIA Pray for the Molucca Islands.

 Fighting erupted on the island of Ambon a year ago and Muslims and Christians are now massacring one another.

 Extreme Islamic voices are calling for a jihad whilst moderates of both faiths try to broker peace between the warring communities.
- **BANGLADESH** Violent cyclones are expected to hit Bangladesh in the new cyclone season. Bangladesh has the most advanced cyclone tracking system in the world but this does not prevent damage. Despite considerable investment in disaster preparedness, there are not enough shelters for everyone.

Europe/Middle East

MIDDLE EAST Continue to pray for the peace process. Israel's chief negotiator in the Palestinian peace talks has said that a framework deal could be achieved soon. A similar deal was to have been signed already, but talks failed over the issues of land that are at the heart of discussions. A framework deal could lead to permanent

peace by September.

CHECHNYA Desperation and uncertainty remain for the civilians of Grozny. Pray that a new future will emerge for them and for those that have fled to neighbouring countries.

Africa

SUDAN Pray for Most Rev Joseph Marona, the newly-elected Archbishop in the Episcopal Church of Sudan, and all Tearfund partners as the national crisis deepens and suffering continues.

SOUTHERN AFRICA Continue to pray for the victims of the flooding in Southern Africa and for the Association of Evangelicals in Mozambique whose relief

programme Tearfund is supporting.

ZIMBABWE Give thanks that the referendum passed safely and that the new constitution proposed by Mugabe was rejected. As campaigning starts for the general election, pray that this will happen peacefully and that the country will enjoy good governance.

Latin America

COLOMBIA Violence against the church has become so bad that a dialogue process with the main guerrilla groups has been started, through which church leaders are asking guerrilla groups to stop persecuting pastors and to allow churches and church schools to be reopened. Give thanks to God for this increase in

communication. Pray that this process will help to bring a lasting peace. Pray for the people of Colombia and for wisdom for all concerned.

BRAZIL Pray for those who have lost so much after the flash flooding in São Paulo.

FLOODS IN SOUTHERN AFRICA



Tear Fund made an initial grant of £25,000 to the Association of Evangelicals in Mozambique (A.E.M.) and have promised to support the rehabilitation work as the floods recede. Our donations amounted to £481 and cheques for this amount have been sent to Tear Fund.
