

The Rector writes

9th June 2001

In this my final contribution to the Deane Church News I wish on behalf of Mary and myself to thank you most sincerely for the love and generosity shown to us by so many of you over the years and especially over our final weekend. We were not exactly looking forward to our last Sunday with you, for we knew what an emotional strain it would be for us and for some of you too. In the event it proved to be easier than we had contemplated and this no doubt was an answer to prayer.

It was most encouraging to see the church so full for the evening service. Though I had planned the order of service, it was the surprise innovations over which I had no control which were especially moving. The children of our St Mary's Primary School singing a modern song with actions to celebrate the resurrection of Christ is one which I and they had learned this term. Our kneeling together to be commissioned for our new ministry in retirement, accompanied by the choir singing John Rutter's "Benediction", originally composed for Clare College, Cambridge, was an excellent idea, and for this we wish to thank Paul Ellis and Jim Needham.

The Farewell Party was a most enjoyable occasion and we are especially grateful to Julie Cooper and her Social Committee for their planning of the event. Rebecca Rutter's cake in the shape of Deane Church is a masterpiece. Though I am very found of fruit cake I have not dared to cut into it yet and when I do I will feel guilty of vandalism! We wish to thank all those who have sent their best wishes on our retirement using greetings cards – well over 100 – and garden vouchers totalling £160. These will come in very useful when we start to plan and stock the above average size of garden at our new home. In addition we received a couple of roses, one of which is appropriately named "Rambling Rector"! I s someone trying to tell me something? For those of you who understandably want to know the contents of those boxes with which we were presented, I can reveal that they contained a music centre and a carriage clock. We also received cheques to the total of £1255. Thank you ever so much for these generous gifts.

I officially cease to be your Rector on July 31st. We shall be moving from the Rectory to our new home on Daisy Hill sometime in July. Our address will be:- 17 Bentworth Close, Westhoughton, BL5 2GN. Before we move I will be completing the unfinished business of handing over various responsibilities to others.

During the period when you are without a Rector Paul Ellis and the three Churchwardens will be appointed as sequestrators and as such will be legally responsible for the parish. In effect Paul will become the Acting Rector. Apart from when he is on holiday, Paul is planning to come to Deane once every Sunday – on the first Sunday to our monthly evening service, on the second and fourth Sundays at 8am and at 10.30am on the third Sunday. But do remember that he also has to minister to the relatively large congregation at St Andrew's, Over Hulton.

Nowadays we are having to depend increasingly upon the ministry of retired clergy and in our parish we are fortunate in being able to call upon Joyce Mitson at Deane and John Hurst at Over Hulton. Joyce will be concentrating on ministering to the elderly and housebound, preparing parents for the baptism of their children and visiting the bereaved. So long as I remain in good health, I hope to be able to continue to serve the Lord whenever and wherever I can be of use. However it is my intention to observe the normal Church of England practice of not returning to Deane except by the specific invitation of Paul during the interregnum, and of my successor once he/she is appointed. This is a good rule for it helps us to recognize that my ministry here has come to an end and that you will have a new leader. In fairness to my successor I trust you will understand this. In the meantime I join with you in prayers about the appointment, for the patrons, for the parish representatives, Les Kilsby and Bryan Shephard and whoever is God's choice. May the Lord bless you and them.

WORLD WATCH Prayer Link Asia

SRI LANKA 2 June is the Worldwide Day of prayer for Children at Risk. Remember millions of children trapped in prostitution. Pray for Tearfund partner Lanka Evangelical Alliance Development Service, educating people about the dark realities of abuse.

BANGLADESH With potentially violent elections looming, monsoon rains threaten many areas too. Pray for all affected, for those bringing relief including Tearfund partners Koinonia and HEED, aware that north and south-eastern regions may suffer like low-lying areas.

Africa

IVORY COAST Child slavery is rife in the cocoa industry. 60% of youngsters are sexually experienced by the age of 16; 14% of teenage girls infected by HIV/AIDS. Pray for greater protection and openness.

SIERRA LEONE After releasing 88 child soldiers to an aid agency in Makeni, RUF rebels say they will demobilise a further 400 youngsters following a pact with the state-backed militia. Pray for children forced to commit atrocities; for aid agencies helping traumatised war victims, including five Tearfund partners.

ZIMBABWE This year Zimbabwe faces a food deficit of 700,000 tonnes; there are no government plans to address the issue. Trust and cooperation between different groups has been severely eroded; pray for Tearfund partners like the Evangelical Fellowship of Zimbabwe, facing huge spiritual and financial challenges.

SUDAN The government's alleged 'scorched earth' policy is driving thousands from their homes, amidst claims that the government is earning \$1 million a day from foreign oil exploration. Pray for peace and stability.

The Middle East/Europe

THE MIDDLE EAST In an area of high conflict and tension, aid agencies are working to rebuild children's lives. Pray for Tearfund partners Stephen's Children in Cairo and Near East Boys' Homes and Cedar Home Orphanage in Beirut, bringing love and practical assistance to children living at the edge of society.

UNITED KINGDOM With the General Election set for 7 June, the Global View 2001 alliance has found that global issues of poverty and injustice concern many prospective voters. Pray for Tearfund's CONNECT!Westminster campaign, raising awareness, helping Christians engage more fully in debate.

Latin America

colombia Film showing an attack on a town involving several child soldiers is believed to be rebel training material. Over 1 million children are victims of conflict. Pray for all assisting them, including Tearfund's Children at Risk facilitator Debora De Arco, identifying new partners, challenging the church to take a greater role.

CENTRAL AMERICA Many people remain landless and homeless nearly three years after Hurricane Mitch; land ownership remains very unequal. Pray for all assisting marginalized groups seeking justice including Tearfund partner Association for a More Just
