



# Editor's Page

Harvest Appeal



Burkina Faso is one of 87 countries in the world which does not grow enough food to feed its people and which cannot afford to buy imported food to meet the shortfall. The average age expectancy is 47. One farmer explains, "We harvest in October-November, but the food only lasts four months. By eating only one meal a day we can make the food stretch out further, but there is still a period from June to the harvest, when there is no food in the barn. We call that time the hunger gap. But we don't just sit around then. We gather the leaves of plants growing wild and use them to make food for our families."

One project, begun by the people themselves, which Tear Fund is supporting, provides **oxen** for farmers. A second farmer reports, "With the oxen we can plough twice as much land as before. The plough goes deeper than when we hoe by hand and so the ground holds more water and there is a better harvest. Since we got the oxen, it has made a real difference." The farmers are encouraged to share the oxen with their neighbours so that many families can be helped to help themselves.

Please consider prayerfully whether you can support this appeal.

# The Alpha Course- an opportunity to explore the meaning of life

Alpha courses start in the week beginning October 1<sup>st</sup>, following an Alpha Supper on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> September. This year St Andrew's are undertaking the organisation, but if there is sufficient support, a course could be arranged at the Deane end of the parish.

## What is Alpha?

# WORLD WATCH Prayer Link

# Asia

**INDIA/BANGLADESH** With the monsoon season barely started, ten million people in the Indian state of Orissa faced their worst floods in 50 years last month. 15,000 villages were flooded, more than 200,000 houses damaged. Pray too for Bangladesh; flash floods in August forced thousands to take shelter on high ground; forecasters predict more heavy rain this month.

**BURMA** UN agencies are calling for a massive injection of foreign aid to avoid a 'humanitarian crisis' here. Sanctions imposed against Burma's military rulers have left the country's poor receiving only a fraction of the aid given to other Asian nations. Pray for more than half a million Burmese people who are HIV positive; one in three children is now malnourished by the age of five.

# **Africa**

SIERRA LEONE Despite the disarmament programme, elections planned for December may have to be postponed until next year. Pray for a country where many people still carry weapons.

**ZIMBABWE** The last joint Commonwealth initiative and the threat of American sanctions has done nothing to halt the upsurge of violence recently and Robert Mugabe seems likely to win next year's elections. Pray for continued strengthening for all aid agencies, including Tearfund's partners in Zimbabwe.

**KENYA** Analysts warn that Kenya's economy faces collapse after parliament last month rejected a bill to set up an Anti-Corruption Authority, regarded as necessary for aid to flow. Pray for positive moves to end corruption.

**D.R. CONGO** Social, political and economic catastrophe has overwhelmed the nation, leaving its people in desperate need. Rwanda refuses to pull out forces until its security concerns are met. In the east, infant mortality rates are estimated at 41 per cent; hospital staff in Rethy say nearly half of their patients last year have died.

# Central Asia/Europe

AFGHANISTAN The encouraging response to Tearfund's emergency appeal is already being used to bring relief to very needy Afghan people, despite the challenges involved. Pray for those still facing hunger, thirst, and displacement, and for the 24 aid workers imprisoned, accused by the Taliban of proselytising.

MACEDONIA Government and ethnic Albanian leaders signed a peace agreement last month, despite escalated violence that left nearly 30 people dead. The first of NATO's four conditions for the deployment of 3,500 troops to oversee rebel disarmament has been fulfilled. Pray for a real commitment to bring peace.

# **Latin America**

#### CENTRAL AMERICA An

estimated 1.5 million people are suffering the effects of a two-month drought. Grain crops, the staple diet for peasant families throughout the year, are beyond salvation. Pray for agencies including Tearfund partners in Nicaragua and Honduras, working with affected communities.

**COLOMBIA** Tearfund partner Project Justice and Life has revealed that uncontrolled aerial spraying of illegal crops in the south has caused health problems to indigenous populations. Please pray for the welfare and rights of those whose subsistence crops like peas and potatoes have also been adversely affected.
