A Happy and Peaceful New Year to all who live in the Parish of Deane. May the year 2002 be the time when many come to know the love of Jesus Christ

Did you know?

Did you know that in Deane we are living within 15 miles of the first recorded place in Britain where there were Christians over 1800 years ago? A Christian word square dated to about 175 AD has been found in excavations of Roman Manchester. You can see the site from the railway line not far from Deansgate station.

Similar word squares have been found all over the Roman world including Pompeii. They are thought to have been used as a secret sign between believers in the days when being a Christian could be dangerous. The actual words have little meaning, but they read the same from left to right and up and down.

SATOR AREPO TENET OPERA ROTAS

Roughly translated from the Latin, this means 'the farmer, Arepo, guides the plough with care'! But rearrange these words and you have the Latin words for Our Father (Pater Noster) forming a cross, with A and O left over twice. A and O are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, Alpha and Omega, and they are often used to represent Christ who is the Beginning and the End.

HIV/AIDS

WORLD AIDS DAY is 1 December.

Worldwide, AIDS claimed 3 million lives, or 8,000 deaths a day in the year 2000 alone. Pray for those searching for hope, and for the bereaved, facing an uncertain future.

partners need enormous emotional and spiritual resources to encourage behaviour change amongst the vulnerable, and to show the love of Jesus to those who suffer.

Asia

KOREA 10,000 rice farmers have protested in Seoul against attempts to further open the country's agricultural markets, threatening their livelihoods. After last month's World Trade Organisation meeting in Qatar, pray for a global trading system that benefits 1 billion people who live in poverty today.

INDONESIA The 40th anniversary of the declaration of independence by Papuan separatists falls on 1 December - the same day planned for the funeral of proindependence leader Theys Eluay. Pray for Christians too in a troubled and divided province, including a recent Tearcraft partner Yaski Art & Craft, based in Jakarta.

Africa

SIERRA LEONE Over 31,500 excombatants have been disarmed, but the UN may despatch more peacekeepers to oversee elections next May. Pray

for Tearfund partner the Evangelical Fellowship of Sierra Leone (EFSL), working with those affected by conflict. **SOUTHERN AFRICA** One in five adults are HIV positive in several countries; the rate

among pregnant women in South Africa rose to 24.5% last year. Pray for Tearfund partners involved in HIV education and prevention like Scripture Union and MAP.

Europe/Central Asia

MACEDONIA Last month saw an upsurge of violence as the Macedonian parliament finally considers ratifying the August peace deal. Pray that the range of constitutional changes that improve the position of the Albanian minority will be ratified.

UZBEKISTAN The country has opened its border with Afghanistan for the first time in four years, providing a major boost to relief efforts. As harsh winter conditions take hold of the region, pray for relief for all those who are cold and hungry at this time.

The Americas

UNITED STATES Last month's plane disaster that killed more than 260 people has devastated a nation still grieving after the events of 11 September. Pray particularly for relatives who mourn: over half of those who died were from the Dominican Republic, many returning from New York for reunions with families.

CENTRAL AMERICA Following

Hurricane Michelle, give thanks to God that this storm caused so few casualties. Pray for the people of Cuba, Honduras and Nicaragua as they seek international assistance to help with emergency efforts to provide housing and food to those most in need.

Congratulations to Tom and Marjorie Stokes who celebrate their Diamond Wedding on January 3rd. They were married in 1942 at St Mary's Church, Plumtree, near Nottingham, having met in 1940 when Tom was stationed in Nottinghamshire and Marjorie delivered the soldiers' post. The early years of their married life were during the war. Tom had a distinguished army career, rising to the rank of captain. He saw service at Dunkirk, was with the allied forces who liberated occupied Europe in 1944-5 and was one of the first people to enter Belsen concentration camp after its liberation. After the war Tom completed his training in Optometry and opened T J Stokes Opticians in Knowsley Street in 1947. He and Marjorie moved to Deane in 1951. Since then they have given a life time of Christian service to the people of Bolton and Deane, Marjorie through WRVS (she holds the WRVS long service medal), Meals on Wheels, church cleaning and much more, Tom as a church warden for over 20 years and as an enthusiastic gardener. Their loyalty and service to Deane have continued long after they 'retired' to Heaton in 1976. A whole newsletter would be too short to do justice to all their good works. We congratulate them on 60 years of marriage and pray that they will have many more happy years together.

News of the Memorial Hall: John Tudor writes

"Early in the year, after full consideration of the costs of repair or rebuild, the PCC decided that the existing Hall should be replaced. In April the Rector was approached by Deane United Reformed Church who requested involvement in joint meetings as they had an interest in a joint project due to problems with their own building.

Since April we have held joint meetings with them and looked at the various options including the merits of existing and alternative sites. In a joint project this could ultimately have resulted in the United Reformed Church having to leave their existing premises. In November they wrote to say that they no longer wished to proceed.

The committee dealing with the project have carried out preliminary investigative work. The cost for a replacement building is likely to exceed £400,000.

To raise this sum we will need to obtain funding from an organisation such as the National Lottery. The preparation of a Lottery bid will require a great deal of work leading to the submission of a business plan. Funding will only be granted to projects which have community involvement. It is extremely unlikely that the total sum would be provided by the Lottery. We will need to carry out fund raising to match any Lottery grant and then possibly some more.

To raise funds we need to start a Hall Rebuilding Fund. Who would like to organise this? Julie Cooper is dealing with the marketing area of the business plan. She would appreciate assistance from anyone with marketing and analytical skills.

The committee involved with the Memorial Hall project consists of John Tudor, Terry Oakes, Alan Rushton. Bryan Shepard, Alison Partington and Julie Cooper with assistance from Mike Kirkby. The committee will keep you informed of progress."
