# Editor's Page

# HM QUEEN ELIZABETH, THE QUEEN MOTHER 1900-2002

It would seem wrong for any church newsletter not to mark the passing of HM Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother. Ever since her marriage to the then Duke of York in April 1923, she gave a lifetime of dutiful service to the country and the wider world. There are many individuals throughout the country and here in Deane who had the privilege of coming into contact with her, not least all those who are graduates of the University of London, the university of which she was Chancellor for many years. Despite the fact that over 2000 graduates at a time passed before her on graduation days, each one received their own smile from her. In his funeral address the Archbishop of Canterbury spoke of her being like the sun. She had "bathed us in her warm glow. Now that the sun has set and the cool of the evening has come, some of the warmth we absorbed is flowing back towards her."

Part of the following saying by M Louise Haskins was quoted on the funeral programme. They were words used by George VI in his Christmas address to the nation in 1939 and may also be found in St George's Chapel, Windsor, where he and the Queen Mother are now buried.

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year, "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown!"

And he replied,

"Go out into the darkness and put thine hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to thee better than light and safer than a known way."

So I went forth and finding the Hand of God trod gladly into the night.

### Christian Aid Week 2002 May 12-May 18

### YOU <u>CAN</u> MAKE A DIFFERENCE! PHIL RAY WRITES:

"In order to cover the Deane area house to house collection, we need more than 60 collectors. Last year we were 10 collectors short, despite some collectors doing two or more rounds. With everyone's help we can do it.

"While house to house collecting is, for most of us, not the most enjoyable thing to do, there are encouragements. As a collector you will be part of a nationwide group doing exactly the same thing. The effort you put in and the contribution that you can make will bring life and escape from misery for many people around the world.

"Your call on each house also demonstrates to people that there still is a social conscience and that there are organisations that care about poverty and suffering.

"Last year the Christian Aid Week collection in Bolton raised over £28000 which was up by 15% on the previous year. St Mary's contribution to the total was £2626 (up by 11% on the previous year).

"My belief is that our church could exceed £3000 this year with everybody's help. I would be delighted if we could prove it. The starting point is simply to sign up on the list in church or to contact me, Phil Ray, (01204 654232) or Malcolm Hearsay (01204 654938). Thank you in anticipation."

# WORLD WATCH Prayer Link

## Asia

**INDIA** It is feared there will be more sectarian violence over the site of Ayodhya; February's violence in Gujurat left at least 68,000 people displaced; over 700 died. Pray for Tearfund partners who are responding to this further crisis in the region after last year's earthquake, including EFICOR, the Discipleship Centre and Emmanuel Hospital Association.

**PAKISTAN** Religious minorities continue to suffer persecution from extreme Islamic groups. Pray for those bereaved after last month's grenade attack during an Islamabad church service, and for 45 left injured including Tearfund's Nic Parham and Ian McClelland. Remember Ayub Masih, a Christian facing execution for alleged blasphemy; his appeal is due at the Supreme Court shortly.

## **Africa**

### ETHIOPIA/ERITREA The peace

process continues well despite tension arising from the issue of which country should control the Eritrean port of Assab. Pray also for the Kale Heywet Church water programme; many staff have recently been ill.

**SOMALIA** Years of drought have combined with devastating political insecurity to create an ongoing food shortage, severely affecting thousands of children; pray for a Tearfund team beginning to meet this need.

### SOUTHERN AFRICA Social,

economic and political unrest in Zimbabwe has reduced harvests, cutting exports to surrounding countries. Drought and corruption have reinforced the food shortage crisis. In Malawi, people have already starved to death; in Zambia, 1.3 million need urgent assistance. Pray for Tearfund partners as they distribute relief, including the Evangelical Association of Malawi. Pray for signs of hope in Zimbabwe.

# Central Asia/The Middle East

AFGHANISTAN US forces are still fighting alongside Afghan troops to drive out al-Qaeda militants; more British forces have arrived. Pray that war will not spread, and for Afghans still suffering: dozens of people in a remote region west of Kabul have died after an outbreak of scurvy, a disease linked with malnutrition.

### ISRAEL/PALESTINE Last month,

the United Nations Security Council passed a resolution calling for the first time for a Palestinian state alongside Israel. With Palestinians praising the move, and Israel welcoming this 'balanced' resolution, continue to pray for a breakthrough, and for an end to escalating violence.

## **Latin America**

ARGENTINA The peso has slipped to a record low amid gloomy predictions that the country's worst ever economic crisis will deepen further. President Duhalde says that without immediate IMF help, Argentina faces more unrest – pray this will be averted, and for Tearfund partners Sacdem and Kairos as they assist many.

**COLOMBIA** Lilia Gongora of Tearfund partner the Latin American Theological Fraternity is part of a team going to Caguan, formerly part of the FARC guerrilla 'clearance zone'. Pray, as the team bring supplies and support on behalf of the Colombian Evangelical Alliance, for peace in this government-reclaimed area.

#### Can You Help?



### Ring out those Bells! Eric Morgan writes:

"At the Queen Mother's funeral on April 9 the tenor bell of Westminster Abbey tolled 101 times before the service. Afterwards half muffled bells rang for two and a half hours in celebration of her life. Over the years Westminster's bells have rung for many coronations, weddings and funerals. At Deane bells have rung since 1541, but the future is in doubt. You may have noticed the silence on many Sunday mornings as you walk down the church path. The simple reason is the shortage of ringers at Deane. There are eight bells in the tower, but only five people to ring them. What we need to secure the future is an infusion of new talent.

If you can count up to eight, then you are welcome to join us for an introduction to the tower. The other requirements are to be able to raise your arms above your head and to be agile enough to climb the short ladder to the ringing room! Simple and nothing to be afraid of! Training is FREE. All that is asked in return is a small amount of time each week. Change ringing, the name given to playing tunes on the bells, is unique to this country.
