

# Welcome to our new Rector

A new era begins in September with the Induction of the Reverend Ian Mainey as the Rector of Deane. The Service of Welcome is on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> September starting at 7.30pm. The service will be led by the Bishop of Bolton, Bishop David Gillett. Everyone is invited to the service after which there will be light refreshments in the Memorial Hall.

Ian has been Vicar of St John's, Hensingham, which is on the outskirts of Whitehaven in Cumbria, since 1991. St John's is one of the largest churches in the Carlisle diocese. He is 51. He and his wife Jean have three children, two sons and a daughter, the eldest at university, the second taking A Levels this year and the third taking her GCSEs in 2003.

The whole church family warmly welcomes Ian and his family to Bolton and looks forward to many fruitful years of Christian fellowship.

# A New Bishop of Manchester

The Rt Revd Nigel McCulloch, at present Bishop of Wakefield, was named as the next Bishop of Manchester as this newsletter went to print. Bishop McCulloch was born in Liverpool. He is looking forward to his move to Manchester later in the autumn, after Bishop Christopher retires. He hopes to keep going the momentum and dynamism that characterised the Commonwealth Games in Manchester this summer.

Bishop McCulloch is Chairman of the Religion in Broadcasting Group. By coincidence the BBC's Religion and Ethics Department is based in Manchester. Bishop McCulloch has already caused comment in the press with his suggestion that the BBC Radio 4 Today programme's Thought for the Day might consider inviting contributions from atheists.

# All this and a New Archbishop too!

After weeks and indeed months of speculation, Dr Rowan Williams was named at the end of July as the successor to George Carey, the Archbishop of Canterbury. Dr Williams was born in Swansea in 1950. He was educated at the local secondary school and at Cambridge University where he read Theology. He was ordained deacon in 1977 and priest in 1978. After many years as an academic, he was elected Bishop of Monmouth in 1991 and Archbishop of Wales in 1999. He married his wife, Jane Paul, in 1981. She is the daughter of a Bishop and is herself a lecturer at Trinity College, Bristol. She contributes a weekly column to the Church Times. They have two children, a 14 year old daughter and a six year old son. No date has yet been announced for Dr Williams' enthronement which is expected to take place in early 2003.

Let us pray for the new Rector, Bishop and Archbishop as they make their preparations to serve God in their new roles.

# **Africa**

### SOUTH AFRICA The World Summit for

Sustainable Development in Johannesburg this month offers a major opportunity for governments to make serious commitments to combat poverty while also positively protecting the global environment. Pray for responsible and effective action by world leaders.

MALI One of the world's poorest nations, Mali's recently elected president Amadou Touré faces a daunting challenge of making democracy work. Pray for new hope, and for Tearfund partner ODES as it moves forward after staff losses due to reduced donor support.

# **SOUTHERN AFRICA** As concern continues for millions facing food shortage and the threat of famine, give thanks that the response to Tearfund's emergency appeal has already enabled partners to step up their response, and will allow them to provide emergency

maize supplies and longer-term aid.

LIBERIA 25,000 people have fled to neighbouring Sierra Leone since fighting intensified in June. Pray that all aid agencies, including Tearfund partners working in the region, bring effective and speedy relief to a war-weary people.

# Latin America

**PARAGUAY** An increasingly unpopular president faces a political crisis after riots last month led to a temporary state of emergency being declared. Seven years of economic stagnation have been reinforced by the economic problems of neighbours Argentina and Brazil, creating fear of a major economic collapse.

BRAZIL Like crisis-hit neighbour Argentina, Brazil is burdened by a massive mountain of debt totalling £179 million. A possible change of president in October's elections could herald a further economic crisis. Pray for several Tearfund partners including ASAS, CEM and TEAR as they work in this context of foreboding.

# Central Asia/Europe

**AFGHANISTAN** Up to 1.2 million refugees are estimated to have returned home so far – over one million of them from Pakistan. Pray that increased security concerns in some areas will not prevent other Afghans from rebuilding their lives in peace and safety.

**KOSOVO** More than half of the population are currently living in poverty – pray for all those working to build up the church in Kosovo including Tearfund partners the Association of International Missions, Kosvarija, RUTH and Messiah Church.

# Asia

## INDIA/BANGLADESH Up to

half a million people in Bihar and Assam are homeless after flooding from early monsoon rains. There are fears of a major disaster in Bangladesh. Pray for all evacuees, and for Tearfund partners NEICORD in Assam, and Koinonia and HEED in Bangladesh as they respond.

**BURMA** Amid claims that the military junta is carrying out a reign of terror against the country's ethnic minorities, pray that democracy and peace can come to Burma. Pray that aid agencies, including a Tearfund partner, will remain effective in meeting the needs of poor communities.

## 550th Anniversary


