

February 2nd is known in the church calendar as both Candlemas and the Presentation of Christ in the Temple.

Jewish parents used to take their first-born son to the temple in Jerusalem on the fortieth day after his birth. It was in accordance with this custom that Mary and Joseph took Jesus as recorded in the gospel of Luke 2 v 25-33.

It is our tradition to take down Christmas decorations by Twelfth Night, but in the past, when Christmas decorations consisted mainly of greenery such as Holly and Ivy, February 2nd was the day by which every leaf and twig had to be removed from houses.

Churches also removed all their greenery to make way for the candles which were always lit on February 2nd giving the name Candlemas to the day.

Candlemas means the festival of candles and it reminds people that Jesus is the Light of the World.

WORLD WATCH Prayer Link

Africa

ETHIOPIA Drought threatens up to 14 million people – pray for rain to bring harvests and hope. Tearfund partner the Kale Heywet Church has held a day of prayer and fasting for the nation; pray that it will move towards economic and political stability for all its people.

SOUTHERN AFRICA At the end of 2002 rains across the region remained lower than average and may continue to be poor due to El Nino threatening the harvest due in April. Millions face a desperate few months, with no food now and their hope for the future at risk. Pray for them and for those working to bring aid.

SUDAN Peace talks between the government and rebels are due to resume this month. With two million people dead and over four million displaced, the needs are great. This year is the twentieth anniversary of war in Sudan; pray that a just and lasting peace will come.

DR CONGO The number of UN peacekeepers has been boosted in a bid to monitor the ceasefire more effectively. Pray this will halt the violence of militia groups, and bring long-term peace that will allow the wealth of the country to benefit all. Pray for Tearfund partners assisting thousands of homeless people.

The Middle East/Central Asia

ISRAEL/PALESTINE Israel prepares for general elections this month. Polls indicate that many voters, frustrated by two years of violence, have

shifted towards more hard-line politics. Peace here has global significance: pray for a positive way forward.

AFGHANISTAN Many refugees returned home in 2002 so give thanks for answered prayer. Some areas face increased insecurity, however. Pray for true peace to come this year, and for vital funding to continue all of Tearfund's Disaster Response Team programmes.

Latin America

BRAZIL The new government headed by Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva officially takes power on January 1st. Pray for its success in managing Latin America's largest economy during an expected 'first year of extreme difficulty' - that a cautious economic course can be balanced with promised sweeping social transformation.

ARGENTINA As 2002 ended, the World Bank again asked Argentina to repay its £500 million debt, or risk existing loans being frozen. Over half the country's 36 million people now live in poverty as recession bites deeper. Pray for them, and for Tearfund partners as they become increasingly stretched to meet desperate needs.

Asia

BANGLADESH Politically motivated violence is increasing; recent bomb blasts in cinemas in the north killed seventeen people and wounded 300. Pray for Tearfund partners working in sensitive situations here; for peaceful Christian witness to be upheld in all countries where Islamic fundamentalism holds sway.

SRI LANKA Last month, the government and Tamil Tiger rebels agreed to pursue a peace deal giving regional autonomy to rebel-held areas in the north and east of the island. Give thanks for this, and pray that the existing ceasefire is built upon this year, to bring stability and peace after almost two decades of civil war.



Sixty Years of Bell Ringing

Congratulations to Ken Higson, the captain of the bell ringers at St Mary's, who this spring celebrates sixty years of ringing the Deane Church bells. No one in the country can have completed more than sixty years of continuous bell ringing since it was only in the spring of 1943 that the country's church bells were allowed to ring out again after a four year silence. Soon after the outbreak of war in September 1939 the government decreed that the signal for an invasion would be the ringing of church bells. Thankfully no invasion came and, with the exception of a few false alarms, the bells of the country stayed silent. By 1943 the threat of an invasion was over and the government decided that church bells should be able to ring out once more to call parishioners to worship. So it was in early 1943 that the young Ken Higson first climbed the belfry ladder to begin a lifetime of bell ringing. We congratulate Ken on sixty years of unbroken service, thank him for all he has done for Deane and hope that he has many more years of bell ringing ahead of him!
