The Rector Writes

From here to eternity.

I was reading an article in my newspaper today. It said that having one's portrait painted has never been so popular. You don't know an artist to paint your picture? There's a web site that can find you one in your locality. The cost? Somewhere between £800-£4000.

Now I have to admit that I would quite like my portrait painted. I don't think it's vanity. To me it would be a bit of heritage to pass on to my children and then on through the succeeding generations. My great great grandchildren would be able to look at it and say, "He looks a bit strange, doesn't he?" Well I mentioned vanity. Although I don't think having my portrait painted would be vain (my wife would probably think differently!) I would hope though that the painter would exercise a bit of artistic licence. I'm thinking here of hair, or should I say the lack of it. It would be nice to be painted with rather more hair than I have at the present time. But I suppose that the thinning of my hair on top is but a gentle reminder of the fact that I am not as young as I used to be.

In fact I have to admit that I am at that point in life where things seem to change very rapidly. I sympathise with Jeremy Clarkson who wrote in an article that time drags its feet in the early years and then "when you get to 33 everything changes. Time straps a jet pack to its back, lights the afterburners and sets off at Mach 3. The sun moves across the sky as though God's got his finger on the fast forward button. Blink and you can miss a whole month."

Just the sad reflections of one growing older, or are they the wise reflections of one who is starting to realise just how short life really is? Such sentiments as that of Jeremy Clarkson are not new. Moses said "The length of our days is seventy years- or eighty, if we have the strength....for they pass quickly, and we fly away." (Psalm 90:10). King David agreed with such sentiment. He wrote in one of his psalms "Each man's life is but a breath." (Psalm 39:5). Had these biblical heroes hit mid life crises, or were they simply expressing things as they really are?

To acknowledge that life is fleeting is to set up camp at reality checkpoint. But, more than that, it is to embrace wisdom. Moses goes on to pray "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). To acknowledge that life is short is the mark of the wise. To live as if death will never come is the mark of a fool. Acknowledging that life is short is the first step to making the most of it. As one missionary put it, "Only one life, it will soon be past. Only what is done for God will last."

Remembering that time has a jet-pack on its back will help us to invest in what really matters when looked at in the light of eternity. It will keep us from putting off until tomorrow the good that should be done today. It will stop us from saying that one day, when we have got more time we'll get serious with God, that we'll get truly committed, and really involved. That we will begin to take our Christian life seriously instead of treat it as a hobby. The wise will always recognise that today is in fact that day.

WORLD WATCH Prayer Link

Asia

CAMBODIA June 7th is the Worldwide Day of Prayer for Children at Risk. Children make up half of Cambodia's population, but face increasing risks from poverty, neglect and abuse. Pray for Tearfund's Children at Risk team, working with Tearfund partners on a month of special activities for children and churches.

BANGLADESH Tearfund partners report an increase of violence against Christians. Militant Islamic followers injured several people as they attended Easter services, and a Christian worker was murdered soon afterwards for showing the Jesus film. Pray for the government too in its bid to halt violence and corruption.

Africa

ETHIOPIA/ERITREA Up to 14

million people urgently need food aid – 4 million more than during the 1984-85 famine when 'Live Aid' was launched. Pray for a swift and sufficient international response to avert disaster. Pray too for all aid agencies working to bring hope, including five Tearfund partners.

ZIMBABWE There are encouraging signs that church leaders are working more closely together to halt violence and intimidation here. But the end of the rainy season will increase the impact of famine. Pray for Tearfund partners helping some of those worst affected.

DRCONGO Rival ethnic militias battled for control of Bunia last month. Most of the population of 300,000 have fled with reports of horrific massacres. Many have fled to Beni, Oicha and the Ugandan border. Pray for Tearfund partners meeting urgent basic needs, and for swift, effective international assistance to halt a genocide.

LIBERIA Civil war is escalating, with fears that violence could spread to neighbouring countries. After attacks from rebel forces recently, Tearfund partner Equip Liberia was forced to relocate to the capital, Monrovia. Pray that vital work can continue; for an end to violence.

Central Asia/Middle East

AFGHANISTAN Security is still deteriorating, especially in the south. Pray that vital supplies will get through to people in need as violence and anti-Western demonstrations increase.

SAUDI ARABIA There is pressure for swift democratic reform, following conflict in Iraq and last month's bomb attack that claimed the lives of over 30 people. Pray the spread of terrorism can be prevented.

Latin America

PERU Tearfund partner Peace and Hope supports those facing political violence or unjust imprisonment. Give thanks that recent prayerful action led to the release of a young Christian man falsely charged with terrorism and imprisoned for seven years. Pray too for Graham Gordon who has left Tearfund's Advocacy Group to work with Peace and Hope this summer.

COLOMBIA Last month, a pastor and three others were murdered by guerrillas in a remote district. A Tearfund partner working nearby will assist the bereaved and help families to leave the area. Pray for church leaders, trade unionists and children who remain most vulnerable to attack. Tearfund's Children at Risk programme seeks to combat hopelessness among many young people.


